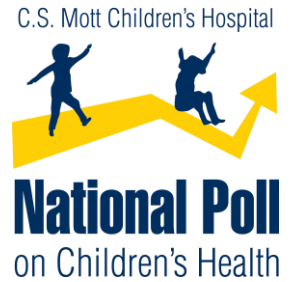


Survey Questions: Parent Concerns about Child Health
